BRANCASTER PARISH COUNCIL

Following the casual vacancy being advertised, there was a call for election, with only one candidate standing. Christopher Platt is therefore deemed elected, and we will welcome him from our December meeting.

We considered ten planning applications at our recent meeting, and as of writing (15/11) we have already had four more for this month. One which may be of interest is the application for the redevelopment of the Brentwood site in Staithe. As ever all applications can be viewed and commented on on the Borough website - <u>https://www.west-norfolk.gov.uk/homepage/169/</u> <u>comment_on_a planning application</u>. You can register on that page to have all local applications sent to you. A reminder that we are a consultee, but the Borough Planning Committee make the decisions – a useful summary of planning rules is available on our website (Planning tab).

You may recall that three major pieces of work have been commissioned by the PC recently – a petanque court, a new fence at Brancaster Playing Field and deer fence at the Allotments. These are either in place, or will be soon (material delays...) and we thank the Sports Club and Allotment group for their contributions to the costs.

Before the last meeting, we had a presentation of the plans for parking in Brancaster Staithe. There was a very large attendance at this, and previous meetings. As a result, there has been a reconsideration of the proposals, and these will be presented publicly again. Please see the item elsewhere from the Parking Group for details; as ever we thank them for their work.

Obviously, things have been difficult nationally over recent months. We get a lot of information about help with the cost of living, fuel, local health issues and so on. You will understand that it is impractical to post this on noticeboards, but we do attempt to ensure that much of it is added to the PC Facebook page. We know not everyone is a member, so we will be adding useful info to our website – Information tab - this also has the advantage that things stay in view for longer.

If you have no online access and cannot persuade a friend or neighbour to point you to things, you could try LILY, a service provided by the Borough Council, by calling on 01553 616200. LILY (formerly "Living Independently in Later Years", but now a wider service) can put you in touch with sources of help relating to specific issues.

Finally, looking ahead to next year we have set aside funds for the celebration of the Coronation (using some unspent from the successful Jubilee events). If you are interested in being involved, please contact the Clerk. As before, there will be some of this funding available to support Parish groups in their activities, so do start thinking now!

Our next meeting is at 6.30 pm on **Tuesday 6th December** at Brancaster Village Hall. The January meeting will be on **Tuesday 10th**, Brancaster Staithe & Deepdale Village Hall.

NEWS FROM BRANCASTER NATIONAL COASTWATCH INSTITUTION (NCI)

Now that the nights are drawing in, we have reduced our watch shifts from 4 hours to 3 hours. We do try to have two watches per day over the week-end (total of 6 hours per day) although this isn't always possible. We are delighted to welcome 2 new volunteers to our ranks – Tess and Paul. 
