Dear Friends,

July can seem to be an in-between time. Within the church the major festivals of Easter, Pentecost and Trinity have been celebrated. There are no church major festivals in July. It is a time between major celebrations, the church calendar calls this 'ordinary' time. And it is not just the church that may see July as a time in-between. For our young people exams are over and, until results are in, definite plans cannot be made. For those waiting to begin their first paid job the last few weeks at school can seem like a waste of time. Others are just waiting for the school holidays to begin so that they can get away on annual leave. Some older folk, perhaps grandparents, long for the holidays as they will see families or visit families who live away and are only seen during the holidays. It is so easy to wish our lives away by focusing on the next anticipated event in our lives or major festival in the church.

By living this way we can overlook that which is important for us today. Our bodies and minds need time to reflect, to switch off and just be. Just being still for a few minutes each day can really help to re-charge our batteries. Try sitting still for just a few moments, maybe in the garden or looking out of the window and reflect on a flower, plant or just a leaf. Take a gentle stroll on the beach or sit on the sand dunes. Take time to look at the colour, the shape, think of all the stages that has gone through to be how and where it is today, what else may have had a part in its development. Listen to the sounds of nature. Taking time to be where we are at the moment, without worrying about what the future holds or wishing the next step of our lives will soon be here, can really help us face that next step, whatever it may be.

Using these in-between times is particularly important when we are facing difficulties or things have not gone as we hoped. When we reach a crossroads in our lives and are not sure which way to turn, taking time out just to be can help 'lighten the load' and maybe make those difficulties a little easier.

Jesus knew the importance of taking time out. He could have easily spent his time with the crowds, healing, preaching, going from one major event to the next. The disciples were often annoyed with him because the crowds were asking for him and Jesus insisted on being alone. He went into the wilderness, he found peace and space on the mountain, time alone to think, pray, contemplate where the next part of his journey should be. Shortly before his arrest he left the disciples and went off alone to pray and find peace within himself for the next step of his journey on earth.

Every day is precious, without today, tomorrow will not arrive. Let's make the most of the inbetween times, make the most of each day and not simply yearn for the next celebration or longed for event.

At the time of writing, the interior redecoration is complete and we are looking forward to our first service since Easter on Sunday 25th June, as well as returning to our usual pattern of services – that is a 9 am Holy Communion on the 2nd and 4th Sundays, and our 10.15 am Family Service on the 3rd Sunday of each month. See the list of services on the opposite page. The church will return to being open to visitors from 9 am till at least 6 pm or quite a bit later on these light evenings. Everyone is welcome to our lovely bright church!

Plant Stall at Deepdale Farmhouse gate Thank you to everyone who has contributed plants and who continue to do so, and to everyone who buys from it. Since the beginning of April it has raised £632. If you need any flower pots, I have been given a very large quantity and would be delighted to share them! Soon there will be produce for sale so do call by and have a look. All proceeds go to the church building maintenance fund.

Books in the Porch Second-hand books will be on sale again from either Sunday 9th July or Monday 10th (after a wedding on Saturday 8th). If you have any good reads you no longer want we would be very pleased to have them but most hardback books don't sell, especially cookery and gardening ones.

<u>Redecorating the church – April to June 2023</u> A year or so ago we managed to complete the repairs to our roof. So, as we were now watertight, it was time to consider internal redecoration of our much loved church. When to do it to provide the best possible conditions for the replastering and special lime-washing of the inside walls? We consulted the Diocesan expert and, as we had been able to raise the funds, we were anxious to go ahead as soon as we could. Our finishing deadline was early July as we had a wedding already booked. However, after delays in obtaining different quotes, followed by an exceptionally cold and damp spring, we chose the period from Easter onwards for our work to start. We selected Brian Warnes of Kaywood Design and Build who has had several years experience of using this kind of lime wash for the interiors of churches and was keen to be involved more with heritage buildings. So as soon as Easter services were finished the church was emptied of its delicate treasures and some very robust scaffolding went in to create a "second floor" for the work to begin.

Since that time, Brian and his team have worked tirelessly to keep ahead of the tight schedule and keep us on track for reopening on time. We must make special mention of Brian's daughter Sapphire who worked on the front door and other more accessible parts. Thanks to their supreme efforts, we were ready for our first service on Sunday 25th June. We are so proud to have this wonderful church looking so much lighter and fresher. Brian has done a wonderful job, on time and in budget. We are looking forward to showing off beautiful St Mary's Burnham Deepdale for our forthcoming Sundays – and in time for the wedding planned in July. The church will be open daily from end of June. Come and see us soon.

ST MARY'S CHURCH, TITCHWELL

We commemorated St Barnabas at our Sunday services on June 11th, his feast day. His name is actually a nickname which means Son of Encouragement, given, we are told in the Acts of the Apostles, after he helped materially poorer believers in Jerusalem. Tradition tells that he was eventually martyred for his faith on the island of Cyprus.

Christians still suffer persecution and martyrdom today for their beliefs; it is said that more people died for their faith on the Lord Jesus Christ in the twentieth century than in all the previous centuries added together. We are fortunate to live peaceful lives in our corner of the world, but our fellow Christians are not so lucky in countries such as Pakistan, China, North Korea and Myanmar, among others. In Russia, the state sponsored Russian Orthodox Church actively persecutes its own priests and members who dare to preach Jesus' gospel of peace in opposition to the war in Ukraine. That said, we need to remember that Church of England some centuries ago was active in the persecution of "dissenters", one of whom was John Bunyan, whose hymn "He who would valiant be" we sang that Sunday. One of my favourite charities is Barnabas Aid (<u>www.barnabasaid.org</u>) that brings material and spiritual aid to persecuted Christians.

BRANCASTER PARISH COUNCIL

As stated last month, we now have a new Council, with all ten places filled – we welcome our new Cllrs and thank Chris Cotton, Christopher Pratt, Richard Roberts, Jeremy Thompson and Robert Lawton who left us in May. Because of the timing of the elections, we have had two meetings since the last Parish News was prepared.

Our <u>new website</u> is finally live. There are still some areas which need to be transferred from the old one, but we believe the new one is more user-friendly, as well as meeting the ever more complicated legal requirements. We are conscious that it is still very text-heavy, and repeat our request for photos which you may be willing to share.

Council has also purchased <u>a new laptop</u> which should help to present planning applications more easily at meetings, allowing us to respond in more detail. We continue to get many applications, and one which caused issues recently was the proposal at Kia-Ora in Brancaster Staithe – the Borough agreed with our objection, and this was rejected.

Members of the Public frequently ask about progress on the public consultation on the <u>double yellow lines</u> <u>etc</u>. This is still with County, and we have heard that things are now moving again – staffing problems being part of the issue. We will keep you informed. Another matter raised is the progress on <u>the Boardwalk</u> – NCC have given a very good summary of the position; this document is available on the News page on the website.

You may have seen in the press that there has been a consultation on plans to reduce the <u>speed limit on the</u> <u>A149</u> between villages. We have just heard that this plan will not be progressed.

It may be of interest that Council has been affected by the rise in fuel prices. Our <u>street lighting bill</u> has more than doubled to over £400 pm since our fixed term contract ended – we have agreed to wait until things are more settled before agreeing a new contract. The maintenance contract with Westcotec to look after the streetlights will end soon and we are seeking an alternative provider.

There was much discussion at the last meeting on keeping the public informed and consulted. There are plans to have <u>a public meeting</u> at some point soon. Details to follow. It is worth noting in the meantime that all of our meetings are open to the public, and all agenda and minutes are on the website. Information is also on the noticeboards, and new ones should be in place before the next Parish News.

We had three large <u>requests for funding</u> from the Churches, the School and National Coastwatch. Because these totalled £20,000 and there are strict legal rules on what Council can do in this area, it was felt that the Finance Group should look at these in more detail and make recommendations, ensuring there are sufficient funds for applications coming later in the year.

As the anniversary of the Brancaster Staithe fire approaches, plans for an <u>emergency team</u> are now progressing. One thing which caused problems last year was that the water supply ran low. Council is purchasing a connector and hose to allow the fire services to access water from the local farms if needed – strangely they had no such facility in 2022.

We have also been asked about providing the locations and codes for the <u>defibrillators</u> in the Parish. This is not the way the system works to ensure they are available when needed. In an emergency, <u>always ring 999</u> <u>first</u>. You will be directed to the nearest device, with instructions on how to access and use it (by a second person). They will remain on the line throughout this process, giving advice. The critical thing is to begin CPR immediately and not leave to look for the defibrillator.

We have welcomed four new members (Allen C, Ian, Frazer and Frank) and four members - William, Richard T, Mark and Paul R - have now successfully completed their service assessment and have received their epaulettes as accredited Watchkeepers. Many congratulations to them! There are now 27 Watchkeepers at the Station. The Station dealt with two potentially serious incidents at the end of April and the beginning of May. In both people were caught by incoming tides, on a sand bar east of the Golf Club and on Scolt Head Island. The Coastguard was called by the Station, but fortunately the people managed to wade or swim to safety, and the emergency services were stood down.

A multi-agency water safety taskforce has been formed especially for Brancaster, involving NCI Brancaster, emergency services, the National Trust and Natural England. This group will coordinate all aspects concerned with keeping people safe on Brancaster beach and its environs.

The NCI Brancaster has been invited to represent the Brancaster Volunteer Community at the Community Champions Tribute parade at the Norfolk Showground on 28th June and at an event hosted by Bishop Graham Usher at the Bishop's House Gardens in Norwich.

<u>NEWS FROM THE NATIONAL TRUST</u> We recently carried out a survey of the birds in the Brancaster Estate area. The coastal path through Brancaster – which combines hedgerow, reedbed and saltmarsh habitats - is an important breeding area for a large variety of both passerine (small to medium-sized perching birds) and non-passerine birds.

A total of 40 species was recorded within the survey area, which was found to be a stronghold for Sedge Warbler in particular. Sedge Warblers are typically spotted amongst the reeds; the male of the species never sings the same song twice, varying their song to impress the females. The area is also home to scarce and/or vulnerable species such as Bearded Tit and Pochard.

Finally, if you go for a walk along the coast at this time of year, you may come across areas that have been fenced off. We do this to protect the nests of ground nesting birds such as Oystercatchers and Ringed Plover. Please help us to protect these important threatened species by staying out of these areas and keeping dogs on leads when nearby.
