Who are your cloud of witnesses? Back in 1929, my Grandmother (who was a very troubled child due to the death of her mother, the grief of which resulted in poor mental health), was invited to be a member of The Manchester Children's Choir. They sang on the stage of The Free Trade Hall with The Hallé Orchestra and a recording was made of them singing Purcell's 'Nymphs and Shepherds'. It sold over a million copies back then! <u>https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=-vkpqHECZtE</u>.

Fast forward to 2008, and our middle daughter Katy joined the newly formed Hallé Children's Choir (HCC). She sang at The First Night of the Proms in The Royal Albert Hall and sang a solo in Carl Davies 'Last Train to Tomorrow'. Then in 2011, our youngest daughter Lucy got in to the HCC. A year later, Katy moved up to the Youth Choir whilst Lucy had the privilege of meeting Victoria Wood. Wood had written a play called "That Day We Sang" for The Manchester International Festival, all about the choir my grandmother was in. This play was then turned into a BBC film called 'Tubby and Enid' and the HCC were asked to play the Choir. So on Boxing Day 2016, Lucy appeared on the television! That play had so many elements of my Grandmother's difficult life knitted through it. I told Victoria Wood this when I met her coming out of a rehearsal one evening and she wrote me the most lovely letter, thanking me for sharing our family's story.

I write about this because Lucy missed out on her final tour with The Hallé Youth Choir because of Covid, but was invited back to join them this July as an alumni singer. They came to Norwich Cathedral, Glebe School kindly let us borrow their mini-bus to get to Norwich and a group of us enjoyed the ethereal singing of the choir as their voices soared up into the vaulted ceiling and echoed around the clerestory. Lucy has had an amazing GAP year, but said the week with her Hallé family was her most enjoyable. Singing is clearly in the family genes; Katy has gone on to get a first in Music at The Royal Northern College of Music and has just been invited to be the Assistant Director of The Hallé Children's Choir as well as securing a place in an opera. www.katyallan.com. Things have come full circle!

Last Sunday's bible reading was all about our cloud of witnesses, Hebrews 11v29 - 12v2. Those who have supported us in our life, have risen in glory and now rest in peace in heaven with the angels, the archangels and all the company of heaven. Those who, like the prophets and Jesus, have challenged and ruffled feathers...I know what this feels like! But I truly believe that there are earthly angels that walk this earth too. Those who appear just when we need them, those who are always there for us even on our bad days, those who are always compassionate and kindly, those who challenge us when we've made a bad choice and stand by us, showing what I call 'tough love', and of course I believe that Jesus is always with us, whether we know Him or not.

Our little trip out to Norwich was thoroughly enjoyed by everyone who came and I've decided we need more of this. There are too many lonely people out there. Glebe School are very generous loaning out their minibuses and in the autumn I'm going to ask if we can borrow it again for some more trips out where we can be each other's cloud of witnesses for the day. I might start with a trip to the gin distillery (but won't partake as the driver), so watch this space! With many thanks to Glebe School and every blessing! Kirsty

NEWS FROM THE BRANCASTER PARISH COUNCIL

We clearly begin with the fire at Brancaster Staithe on 19th July. Council wishes to thank all those involved – emergency responders, residents and organisations who reacted on the night, and have been involved in the follow-up, the Borough Council and those who have donated since. At the time of writing over £9,000 has been raised on the JustGiving page, and money from this will soon be making its way to those in need. If you were affected, <u>please</u> do apply – a form is available on our website, though it is independent of the PC. There will be a Public Meeting on **Friday 7th October**, at 6.30 pm in Brancaster Staithe Village Hall. This will be to look at the effects of the fire, what has been learned, and suggestions to help avoid a repeat. Council has agreed that it will support the establishment of a committee, again as an independent group, to act as co-ordinators in the event of future emergencies. We will be looking for three or four committed individuals who can help co-ordinate with external services, directing and organising the local response. Please contact the Clerk if you would be prepared to be involved. Council urges the public that there is continued risk of fire due to the dry conditions and to act with extreme caution.

Last month we mentioned the **Freebridge Housing Scheme**. The latest plans are for social rent housing with one one-bed, four two-beds and seven three-beds. If you have not already registered an interest in these, please visit the Borough Homechoice page at <u>https://www.west-norfolk.gov.uk/info/20001/housing</u>.

Council has confirmed replacement of the fence at Brancaster Playing Field with one made from recycled materials. We have applied for grant funding to cover 50% of the cost of this.

We continue to work on providing parking at both Brancaster and Brancaster Staithe. Things are with the lawyers at the moment, and planning permission is out for consultation. The plans for parking restrictions are progressing following the recent survey, taking into account recent high tides and the concern over access for emergency vehicles, highlighted recently.

Again, we ask for contractors interested in doing work for Council to contact us – please let the Clerk know, and outline the types of work you can do. We risk Highways removing them completely if they are not kept in the locations already agreed. As difficult and frustrating as it may be to get through the village or out of driveways, please do not move the cones. We would like to thank all those people who have kept an eye out and put back the cones after they have been moved or damaged by cars or groups of children having "fun". It has been a great help having extra hands on board. Thank you once again for all your support and don't forget to keep sharing our Facebook group, so that good information about tides and other issues specific to Brancaster beach get out to as many people as possible!




