Dear Friends,

I wonder what comes to mind when we think of the month of June? Perhaps mid-summer, the longest day, the summer solstice, father's day, the birth of John the Baptist, amongst others. This year the first Sunday of June is Trinity Sunday - God as three in one. God as father or parent, God as son or child, God as holy spirit or helper. In the relationship of the Trinity we see the working of a perfect loving equal relationship.

Within our own lives we live and work in relationships. In many of these relationships we expect one person to be the boss or the head with authority over others. Within the Trinity many have held that God is head over Jesus (son) and the Holy Spirit. This is because of a misunderstanding of the word head used in the bible in New Testament times. The Greek word for head is 'Kephale.' According to Liddel in the Greek-English Lexicon covering new testament times, head means source, origin, starting point, it does not mean chief or having authority over. The early Greek biblical scholars held that Father, Son and Holy Spirit are equal in goodness, power and love. Each part of the Trinity has a different role which is exercised in equal respect and love. Whatever our role in our many relationships, are we able to hold this understanding of equality, respect and love?

Until Roman times the summer solstice was celebrated on 24th June although the longest day - in the northern hemisphere - is 21st June. With the shortening of days and the thought that the sun was becoming weaker, fires were lit on the eve of mid-summer's day to praise, encourage and strengthen the sun to stop it 'losing power'. A good harvest depended on the sun. Domestic beasts were also blessed at this time by walking them around the fire. Although we may no longer believe that these traditions may influence the sun we know that our relationship with the earth can influence the effect of the sun.

Another belief was that the sun was 'all powerful'. Activities such as sport, trials of strength and horse riding were held. This was believed to encourage growth of crops - the highest height jumped would be the height of the harvest. The only participants were men. This was the beginning of father's day, which continues to be celebrated on the Sunday before midsummer's day. Father, and those in the role of fathers, is a relationship that at its best shows that of the Trinity of respect, equality and love.

The bible tells us that John the Baptist was born 6 months before Jesus. With the adoption of Christianity the birth of John the Baptist was (and is) celebrated on June 24th. St John's Eve (like the eve of many festivals) was seen as a time when powerful forces were around.

Our traditions and understandings may change, they may be different from those we find ourselves in relationship with - at work, in the community, with this world and nature, in our families, at church or amongst friends. In his relationship with others Jesus was able to show the way of the Holy Trinity. He treated all people with respect, equality and love. When he needed guidance he prayed to God, and listened to those around him. At times he changed his understanding - remember the Samaritan women who explained to him that his ministry was for all people and not just the Jews? When our relationships follow that of the Trinity they bring respect, equality and love to ourselves and those around us. When they do not then we need to find space and time to think, someone to talk to. Even when we are doubtful to whom we speak when we pray, voicing our concerns and issues can open new directions or new ways. I pray that we can all use the longer days of June to uphold and enhance our good relationships and to find time to examine those which are not so good.

NEWS FROM THE HUNSTANTON FOODBANK

The foodbank continues to support local people in need, and grateful thanks are due to all our kind donors, particularly as we know just how sacrificial giving at this time can be.

We are a small organisation compared to some foodbanks, but we gave out just over nine metric tonnes of food in 2022 and demand shows no indication of slackening off. The current financial crisis and high inflation, particularly in the price of food, is causing real hardship for many.

At present we would be particularly grateful for donations of tins of meat, custard, fruit, rice pudding and spaghetti rings, as well as breakfast cereals, UHT milk, fruit squash and toilet paper. We have a collection point behind the check-outs in the Hunstanton branch of Sainsburys and in the shop at Burnham Deepdale - our thanks are due to both shops.

NATIONAL COASTWATCH INSTITUTION BRANCASTER (NCI BRANCASTER)

NCI Brancaster is a member of the National Coastwatch Institution which was founded in 1994. It is one of six stations operating in Norfolk and was established on its permanent site at The Royal West Norfolk Golf Club in 2022. The station is currently staffed by 27 watch keepers and undertakes a critical role in keeping Brancaster beach and coastal waters - which can be very hazardous – safe for all users. The service works closely with the Royal National Lifeboat Institute and the Maritime and Coastguard Agency as well as other emergency services. In its short life NCI Brancaster has, by responding proactively, made an immediate impact by reducing the number of RNLI callouts.

This important service has already attracted strong support from the community and it is crucial that this continues in terms of additional volunteers and resources to purchase a new watch office (the current building is second hand, and in many ways unsuitable for the long term needs of the service) and vital equipment to carry out tasks.
