Dear Friends,

This year March brings two church celebrations, Mothering Sunday and Easter Sunday. There is also the week leading up to Easter, known within the church as Holy Week which begins on Palm Sunday. The fourth Sunday of Lent, Laetare (rejoice) Sunday has traditionally been a day of celebration within the austere period of Lent. A day of hope with Easter in sight. In Britain this became Mothering Sunday, more recently known as Mother's Day. For the church Mothering Sunday embraces all those who show a mother's love, not just our birth mother. The perfect example of a mother's love is seen in God. God's all embracing love is freely given to all people. God does not see the barriers that we may find difficult - race, colour, culture, gender - to name a few. The ultimate act of love was for God to come to earth to show us the way of love. This we see in Jesus. Jesus broke with the traditional understanding of his faith by showing that God loves all people equally. The kindness, caring and love that Jesus showed was rejected by many who felt their lifestyle threatened. Their interpretation had allowed them to keep themselves in positions of power, wealth and control, and they were determined to silence him. The joy of Palm Sunday when Jesus rode into Jerusalem being cheered by the crowds, the ordinary people who saw him as their saviour and friend, those against him moved to the cross on Good Friday. Jesus knew that nothing could separate him from God's love. However difficult things became he knew God's love would hold him in the dark times. Even in the agony of the cross he continued to show God's love and forgave those who had crucified him. Jesus knew dark times, times of rejection, times of physical and emotional pain, times of bewilderment, times of being very much alone, all the emotions that life can throw at us. In these times of deep despair he was able to focus on God and his life journey in the way of God. This led him through the agony of the cross to resurrected life. This new life we celebrate at Easter.

Through our Easter celebrations we are surrounded by symbols of new life - spring flowers, eggs, lambs and other young animals and birds. The days are getting longer - this year Easter Sunday is the first day of British summer time - the clocks 'spring' forward an hour. All around nature shows signs of new life, but this doesn't happen in isolation. Each new life needs help to blossom. Plants need nutrients from the soil, sun and rain, animals and birds need care from parents. Whilst on this earth Jesus needed the love of his parents and friends and he knew God's love. We too cannot find new life in isolation, we need care, friendship assistance from others. At times we can give this to others, at times we need to receive from others. The new life we celebrate at Easter can bring new life to all people, ourselves, our families and friends and those of the wider world if we allow it to.

THOUGHTS FROM TITCHWELL

Recently I came across these words written by an American priest when she found herself at a crossroads in her life, and they have kept going round in my head ever since: *I had arrived at an understanding of faith that had far more to do with trust than with certainty.* It is religious certainty that is making the world a dangerous place, be it the belligerent version espoused by the Kremlin and the Patriarch of Moscow or the not dissimilar sort to be found among some on Capitol Hill and elsewhere in the USA. However, God does not take sides in a way that some would have him do. Early on in the Bible, we read how Joshua, a leader of ancient Israel, found this out when coming across what appears to have been an angel: *When Joshua was near Jericho, he looked up and saw a man standing in front of him with a drawn sword in his hand. Joshua went up to him and asked, "Are you for us or for our enemies?" "Neither," he replied, "but as commander of the army of the Lord I have now come." Religious certainty can also cause problems for us as individuals. A simple trusting faith in a loving God should make us more tolerant of the opinions of others, and gentler people into the bargain. Seeking to establish this attitude of trust within our hearts would make a profitable exercise for Lent as we prepare to celebrate the resurrection of Jesus on that first Easter Day.*

BRANCASTER PARISH COUNCIL

Our most recent meeting was on 6th February. On **Flooding**, we were made aware of particular issues on Broad Lane. We also await information about the recent meeting in Burnham Market with Anglian Water. It may not always be clear, and these are matters which are not within the PC's remit, but we do our utmost to help signpost people to the correct authorities, and support them with their problems. We are writing to our MP to reinforce this process. While we are all aware that the consequences of climate change may make some things impossible to deal with, there should be more clarity about who is responsible for drainage and other issues. The question of increased Council Tax on "second" homes was raised. Our parish is one of the areas most impacted by this – 40% of dwellings apparently fall in this category, in line with several adjacent parishes. We are aware that the Borough has agreed to raise the tax to 200% of the normal rate from 2025/26, and is seeking to ensure that the increased income comes to the area where the effects are felt -92% or more goes to the County, Police and Crime Commissioner and Internal Drainage Board. The PC is clearly keen to ensure that those parishes most affected also benefit from any such local rebate – second home owners are also our parishioners, and their contributions should benefit them and their neighbours. You will also be aware that Council had to arrange the eviction of a man who was **rough-sleeping** on Brancaster Playing Field, with his horse. This was not a straightforward, or cheap, procedure but we had to ensure that due regard was given to the rules. It was not a decision taken lightly, but the needs of all our residents had to take priority. Rest assured, the gentleman was given every opportunity to avail himself of the assistance offered, but Council could not force him

With regard to the "Big Chat" last year, a full breakdown of the issues raised and Council's response is available online, and we are working through those subjects raised where we can take action. Finally, we can confirm the date of the "Green Day" – Saturday 16th March. (*Please see article on page 8*)




