April, a lovely month full of new beginnings. With Easter being almost as late as it can be this year - Easter Sunday is 20<sup>th</sup> April - school holidays begin early April. With the holidays, our beautiful area of West Norfolk will again ring with the delightful sounds of young children. A few brave folk may venture into the sea. Picnics, fun and games on the beach, fairground, arcades, parks and so much more all 'come alive' as the weather warms. Yes, there may be a few April showers but they don't stop the young from enjoying themselves - jumping in muddy puddles is always a delight. Our local shops need the boost to their business that this first main holiday of the year brings. The shops have certainly been planning for Easter for some months - the first hot cross buns I saw in a local supermarket were on Boxing Day! Easter eggs were on display almost as soon!

New beginnings don't just happen. Bulbs, flowers and other plants have been nurturing in the ground for some weeks or even months. They need soil, nutrients and water to survive. They also need bees and other insects to pollinate them. Some animals have nurtured young in their wombs and others have spent many hours incubating eggs. The mothers have been cared for by farmers or other owners or by the male bird feeding the nesting bird. For us new beginnings can take many months or even years following difficult times.

The second Sunday in April is Palm Sunday when Jesus rode triumphantly into Jerusalem on a donkey. The crowds cheered with anticipation that at last the one who would free them had arrived. How quickly this faded into shock, anger and despair as it became obvious that Jesus was not going to raise an army. His continuous teachings against the traditions of the leaders soon lead to his downfall and the crowds deserted him. The brilliance and joy of Palm Sunday turned to the anger and darkness of Good Friday. Even his closest friends deserted him. What had seemed like a new beginning had faded into a disaster. However just three days later a new beginning came about, a brighter and more loving beginning than anyone could have thought possible. With his resurrection Jesus had conquered death, darkness was replaced with light, not just for Jesus but for all people. At times we all face darkness, just as Jesus did in the garden of Gethsemane and it can seem that new beginnings are just impossible to contemplate. Jesus was able to continue to trust in a loving God. A love that held him through the dark times to the light of being with God. Easter is about being held in love and experiencing new loving beginnings for ourselves, our family and friends, communities and the wider world. A warm welcome awaits you at our services on Easter Sunday. A very happy and joyful Easter to you all.

<u>Flood Warning Signs</u> A positive meeting with Highways has resulted in agreement on locations and a possible programmable format for new flood warning signs. The design process is now underway, and installation dates will be confirmed in due course.

**Brancaster Village Hall Car Park** Work is also progressing on the proposed extension to the car park at the Village Hall which will ensure safe additional parking and access for visitors.

<u>Village Green Improvements</u> A Councillor working group has been set up to progress ideas for restoring the Green. A plan will be prepared for discussion with the National Trust and the Sailing Club to ensure all views are considered before work begins.

A brass plaque records the gift of the Edwardian pews given by the Royal West Norfolk Golf Club in 1904.	Among the treasures within the church are the medieval font with its carved wooden cover given to the church nearly 500 years ago, and the carving of an old man with his head at a strange angle. He is St. Matthew with the gospel in one hand and a money bag in the other. He originally stood on top of a wall post looking down the nave.	The tower housed four bells until 1790 when three were sold to pay for repairs. The remaining one was recast by Thomas Osborn of Downham Market.
